

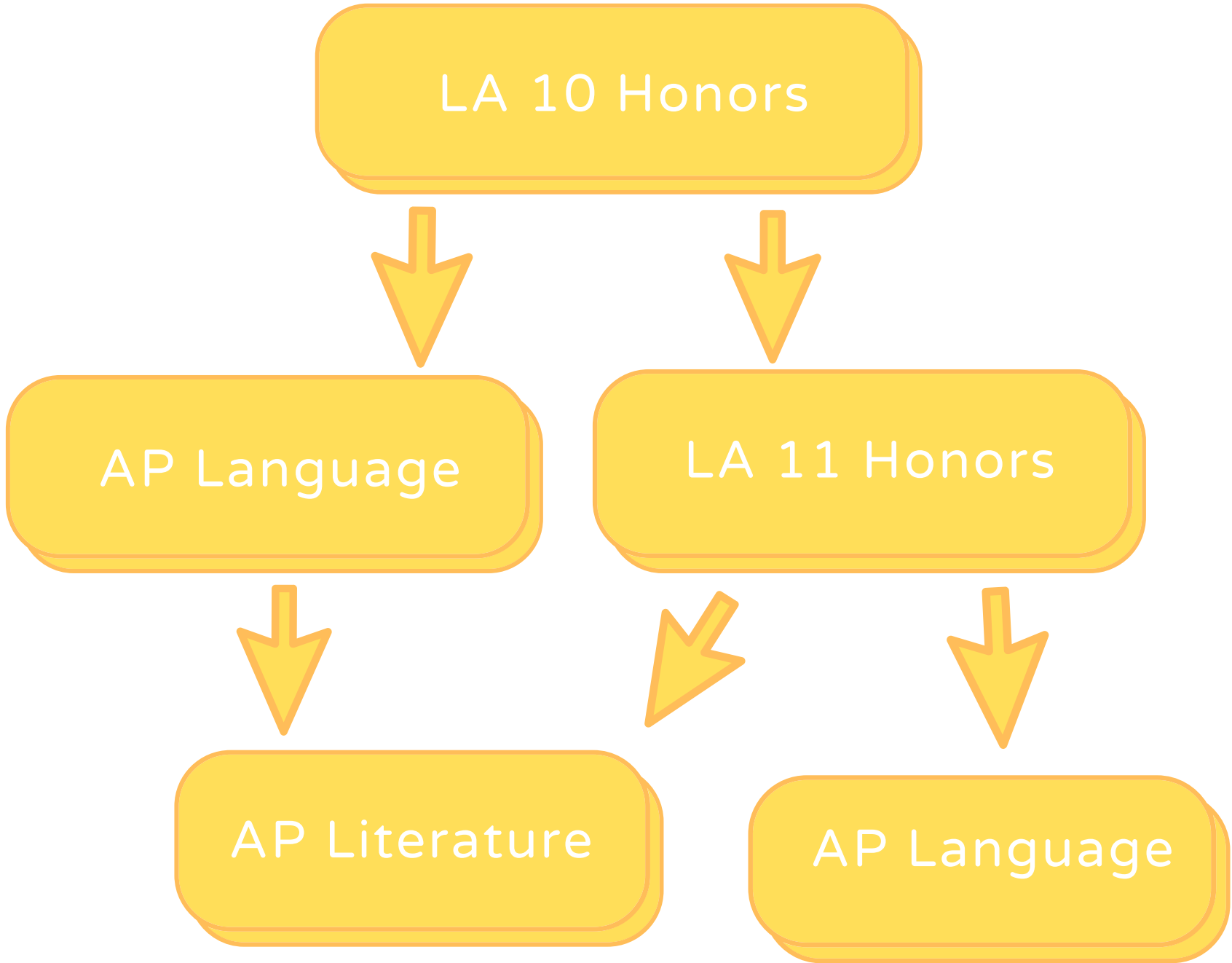
Recommended Paths for LA Credit

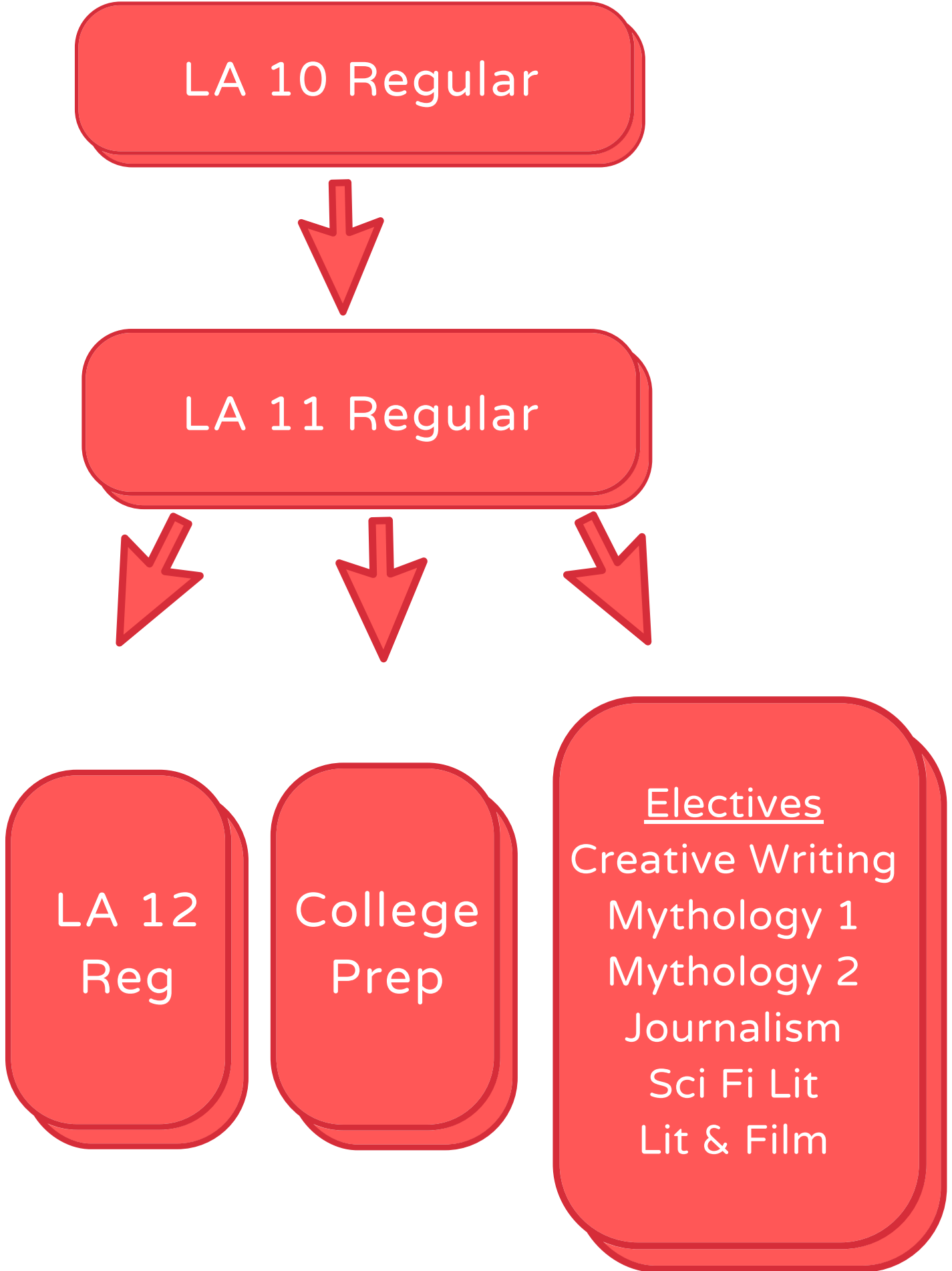
*Note that teachers may identify students to encourage to move up a level (honors, etc.) after they get to know them and their skills better

*The AP path is preferred if a student is considering applying for Sterling Scholar as a senior.

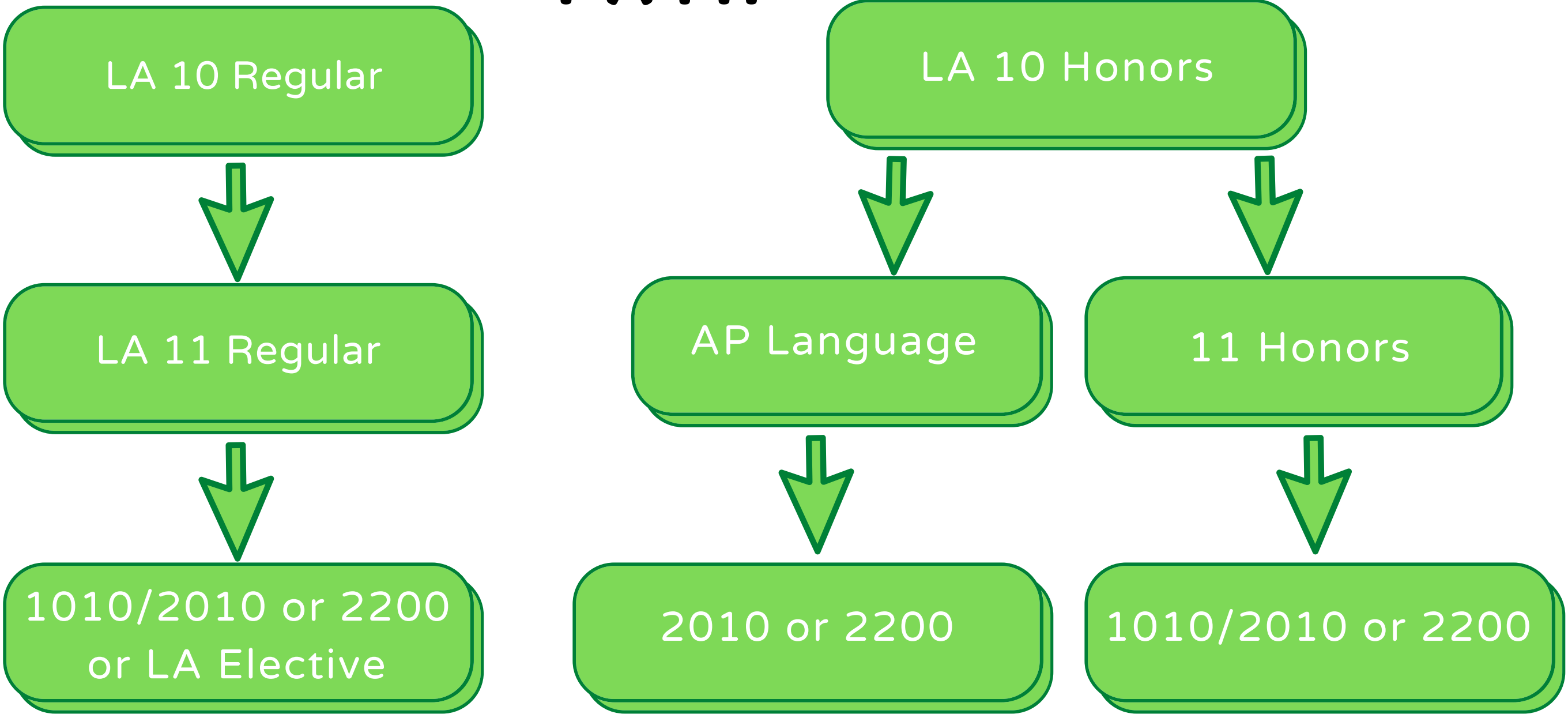
AP ENGLISH PATH

AP Myth Busters:

- * If a student is feeling overwhelmed on this track, then a meeting with: 1-their current teacher 2-their parent and 3 their counselor to brainstorm multiple options before making a switch will be encouraged.
- * Homework: Students can expect no more than 30-45 minutes of homework between each class session for these courses (just like Concurrent Enrollment)
- *Our teachers have exceptional passing rates and know how to prepare their students for both AP tests. All of our passing rates are above the state averages, and definitely above the national averages

Concurrent Enrollment Myth Busters

- *Homework: You can expect no more than 30-45 minutes of homework between class sessions in Concurrent, AP, and Honors classes.
- *A C or better in ENGL 1010 is a Prerequisite for ENGL 2010, but no Prerequisite is required for ENGL 2200.
- *1010 is a fall course only; 2010 and 2200 are spring courses only.
- *All LA Concurrent Enrollment courses are for Seniors Only.
- *Credit Transfer is different depending on which college you attend.
- *Concurrent Courses are all SLCC courses and, as such, are each a semester long.
- *There is a short window to transfer out of this class with no lasting penalty on your SLCC transcript.

AP vs. Concurrent

AP

Concurrent Enrollment

- Can Save \$\$
- You are a SLCC student taking the course on the high school campus.
- Your grade will start/affect your college transcript
- Must receive a C or better to get credit

- 30 - 40 minutes of homework at night
